# **Sweet Outreach Opportunities**

Each year, our Peruvian pastors weave the gospel into a local Christmas tradition called *Chocolatada*. Especially popular with children in limited-resource areas, this event involves neighbors, churches, and other organizations handing out hot chocolate and sweet bread or panetón. The children play games and sometimes receive small Christmas gifts.

Our pastors and church members use this secular celebration to hand out tracts, preach, witness, and extend church invitations.

### Dear friends, prayer warriors, and supporters of BEME-LA,

January has BEME in forward advancement, filled with thankfulness and prayerful anticipation of another fruitful year as the Lord tarries his eminent return:

**Thankfulness**, as we look back on 2022 and see all the growth through new births (both spiritual and physical), discipleship and baptisms. Many of our Latin American pastors have been working successfully on building projects and evangelistic programs through the school year. The mission has seen remarkable increase in financial support and funding for the mission's transportation needs.

**Prayerful**, because some of our church starters are working in countries presently experiencing civil/political unrest. This does not stop ministry, but makes it more challenging for summer camps, Bible classes, evangelistic campaigns, and regular church services. One of our advisors in Uruguay recently stated, "I find myself praying with verbs like "renew," "restore," "refresh," "revive." I find great comfort in the fact that God's strength is made perfect in our weaknesses (2 Cor. 12.9). Please pray for a calming in these countries and that ministry events are not hindered.

**Anticipation**, despite setbacks from the Adversary, our church starters continue to successfully labor and see results in church growth. They continue to energetically push forward into the summer or winter months (*depending on the hemisphere*). Also, Jo and I have another full schedule and are back on the road presenting BEME. This month we start our year with three conferences, followed by multiple church presentations. Pray that more churches will schedule meetings, take on BEME for regular support, our good health, and travel mercies.

# **Sunday School Update**

Recently, Pastor **Ernesto Vera** sent us pictures of the full Bible story flannelgraph set he was able to purchase with the funds collected by the 2-year-old to 3rd grade Sunday School classes at First Baptist in New Lisbon, WI.

Pastor Ernesto said, "They are very good materials to help the children understand the stories of the Bible, and we are already putting them to use. We are very grateful for your support."





Please continue to pray for this Sunday School. Rumors of child abductions for the purpose of organ collection have resurfaced in **Curahuasi**, **Peru** over the past few months. Concern among parents has, unfortunately, led to a sharp decline in attendance in childrens programs. Bible club was averaging 50 children each week, and now fewer than 20 attend regularly.

Ernesto hopes that 2023 will bring fresh opportunities for the Lord to work in this city and that the children will return to church.

On a positive note, on the way home from a pastors conference in Lima last month, Ernesto had the chance to witness to his wife's relatives in Arequipa. Praise the Lord, one of them accepted the Lord as Savior!

### **Activities and Additions**

December and January have been busy months for **Pastor Ignacio Salazar in Zacapoaxtla, Mexico**. His church has been running a Bible club for a few weeks, with 30-40 children attending. He is praying that the children continue to come to church once Bible club is over.



The church also held evangelistic campaigns in 2 different neighborhoods. Between them, over 200 people heard the gospel!



In the midst of the activities, the men of the church constructed an addition of 5 meters (almost 16.5 feet!) onto the building, increasing the capacity to 100 people.



Stone pavers were installed in the sanctuary, which provide the added benefit of more warmth in winter. Ignacio is not only grateful to God for providing the pavers, but also for giving the men strength to move 850 of the 22-pound stones so far. *Only 500 to go!*
