Ignacio Salazar in Zacapoaxtla, Puebla, Mexico

In the Sierra Norte region of Mexico, the children's Bible club in the community of Las Lomas has 11 children coming faithfully each week to hear the Word of God. Pastor **Ignacio Salazar** shared with us that many of them come from troubled homes and suffer the effects of alcoholism, drug addiction, and broken relationships, among other problems.



Pastor Ignacio shared their names and would appreciate specific prayer for Jennifer, Ethan, Andrés, Dayana, Carlitos, Cristian, Jennifer, Brenda, Aishlin, Cristal, and Guadalupe.

Ignacio began a marriage ministry within his church and has extended it to the Las Lomas families, as well. This has been a great way to get close to new and unsaved families and show them biblical ways to improve their marriages, and lead many to a saving knowledge of Christ. Your prayers are appreciated for the 7 couples in counseling: Nayeli and Everardo, Rogelio and Lucia, José and Guadalupe, Manuel and Lety, Fernando and Luz, Valentín and Nancy, and Pablo and Karina.

She became very angry to hear them say that only Jesus Christ can give eternal life, not the "apostle." Ignacio said that they often try to explain the gospel to Light of the World followers, but many are already blinded by and devoted to its teachings, which have had a deep hold on the area for over 30 years. Please pray that God would open the landlord's eyes for salvation and provide the Salazars with a smooth transition to a new place to live. 2


Third: The opening up of Bolivia for the next expansion of BEME. I will be meeting with a seasoned missionary to interview and prayerfully start our first supported church in this country.

Report from Alcides Peña in Cusco, Peru





Pastor Alcides Peña was one of the national pastors we supported during the pandemic, whose innovative and persistent evangelistic efforts resulted in growth despite the unique difficulties of the times. BEME has prayed and facilitated support for the church's land purchase and construction projects, both of which have faced frustrating challenges over the years. However, Alcides and the team have not waivered in the goal of constructing a church building that will stand the test of time and reach those who desperately need Christ in Cusco, Peru. The following is an update on the construction. Please join us in praying for the needs of this faithful church and its pastor.

June 10, 2023

May God's GRACE and mercy abound in your lives, as it is our desire that He bless you in abundance. We thank the Almighty God for His great and undeserved favor toward us and for His provision thus far.

The "Solid Rock" Baptist Church in Cusco, Peru sends a warm greeting in the precious name of our Lord Jesus Christ.

The reason for this letter is to ask for your prayers for financial provision to conclude the construction of our church building. We are currently in the process of construction. The Lord provided us with an offering through a family and we are very grateful in a special way to God for this family. With this offering, we purchased construction materials and the current progress is shown in the picture below.



So far, God has provided, through that family and our very own believers of the church, many of whom have given offerings beyond their strength; others donated cinderblocks, and some their time and strength to work. We give thanks to the Lord for that. The believers of the church are very excited to have a large space to congregate, but as our church anniversary approaches, there is still work to be done and the offerings and funds we have raised have run out.

Therefore, brothers, we first turned to the Lord to ask Him to provide what is necessary to finish our building, and we also turn to you to help support us in prayer for this need. We still have to complete the flooring, which is still dirt, and the remainder of the metal structuring, along with the windows and the doors. The following picture shows the dirt floors, which must be poured or filled with cement.



Below is the side where the pulpit will be, although we still need to lay down more wood and cover the wall.
