Josué González (Saltillo, Mexico) asked us to pray for Carmen Lujano (*left*). Despite being the oldest church member, she leads the children's Bible club. A year ago, her daughter died and she fell into a deep depression, her health declined, and she stopped attending church. With the help of her church family, her pastors, and godly discipleship, Josué refers to her life today as *"a reflection of the Lord's consolation."* She still struggles with occasional bouts of depression, but she is a faithful testimony of service and love for God.

Manuel Macancela's son, Daniel (*right*), leads a large Saturday Bible club meeting with children ages 4-14 at the **Baptist Church in Shell**, **Ecuador**. The group has more than doubled from an average attendance of 25 in March, to over 60 by mid-May into June. These children represent a range of indigenous backgrounds, including *Quechua, Shuar, Achuar, Shiwiar*, and other diverse ethnicities.

Enrique Cadena in Ecuador

In the country whose name translates to *halfway point* (*and, yes,* it also means *equator*), *"Middle of the World"* Baptist Church has steadily increased its presence in the city of Mitad del Mundo, located about 16 miles north of Quito's center and named for the monument there that marks the location of the equator.



Pastor **Enrique Cadena**'s supporting church sent an offering allowing for the purchase of a larger, backlit church sign, a replacement for the obsolete computer, a speaker, and microphones, which will all be very useful during church services, activities, and for outdoor preaching.



Leftover funds were used to meet other needs, such as snacks for the current kid's Bible club, which will draw to a close at the end of June.



Over the past three months, Enrique, his wife Cila, and church helpers have sown the seeds of the gospel and many children have made decisions for Christ, as a result.

The simultaneous parenting classes generated a lot of interest, as well, and funds from the offering stretched to provide monthly blessing bags of food and necessities offered to faithful parent participants.

Vacation Bible School is coming up on the week of July 17th, so keep the prayers coming!

**We just received word that Enrique was recently sick and spent a few days in the hospital. Please pray for his continued recovery and improved health.

On top of that, we recently received a Vacation Bible School offering of over \$2100.00! It is good to see children exposed to and invested in missions work.



We praise the Lord that our schedule continues to be filled with

meetings and conferences, and, when possible, helping in our local church with Vacation Bible School, summer camps, and occasional Sunday School and mid-week preaching.

The office continues to receive and translate more applications from men desiring to start churches in Latin America. We pray that BEME can facilitate these church starts. We are also hoping to finish some much-needed administrative work. The Lord's work is not without challenges, but His Word is our security, and His will is to spread the gospel. Please pray for energy, strength, and wisdom as we seek to tackle these tasks.

While we were on the road in Illinois, we saw a sign that said, "Start near. Go far." What a great line, that can be applied to how local spiritual involvement has global effects—this is the summary of global missions. Remember that your encounters with God through prayer, witnessing, encouragement, and financial support can take the gospel into faraway cities, villages, and jungles. It is a blessing that each of us is significant in God's work. (*1 Corinthians 15:58: Therefore, my beloved brethren, be ye stedfast, unmoveable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, forasmuch as ye know that your labor is not in vain in the Lord.*)

Please pray for us, as our mission work will be taking us into the Midwest, down South, and then we'll be finishing up the summer with a 17-day trip to South America that will include a national pastors' conference in Ecuador, the commemoration of the 25th anniversary of our first church plant in Peru and opening up for expansion into Bolivia.

Where will your spiritual journey for Christ take you this summer? It may be hard, hot, and humid, but the gospel provides the thirsting soul with grace, cooling, and comfort. Whatever your journey, we hope it will bring forth fruit for the Lord.

Sacarias Ccopa in Peru

The recent activities at *Calvary Baptist Church* in Yaurisque demonstrate that equipping the congregation with solid biblical doctrine is at the forefront of Pastor **Sacarias Ccopa**'s ministry.

This month, a series of conferences and workshops for men and women were organized and led by Pastor Sacarias and other national pastors working in and around the area, including **Alcides Peña** (*above*), who was a recipient and faithful steward of BEME support a few years ago. Pastor Alcides still pastors at **Roca Fuerte** ("Solid Rock") Baptist Church in the Alto Qosqo area of Cusco. (Stay tuned for updates on his ministry in the next newsletter!)

For the three days leading up to Calvary's 2nd anniversary, believers will gather in the evenings for Bible study and worship. The anniversary will be commemorated during services on July 2nd. Typically, there is also a big cake involved at this sort of event—*after the service, of course!*

Among obvious reasons to engage the church in sound Bible preaching and study, Sacarias reports alcoholism and idolatry as some major barriers to the gospel in this area (here, we share some common ground with Peru).



For almost $\frac{2}{3}$ of her life, Sacarias' youngest daughter Noemí (9 *mths*), has worn a corrective brace to treat hip dysplasia. So far, it seems to be working, so Noemí will, Lord-willing, avoid the surgery that her sister Sarai (5 *yrs*) underwent twice as an infant. Please keep this precious little one and her big sister, as well as Sacarias and his wife Alicia, in your prayers.

Manuel Macancela in Ecuador

In recent months, both **Manuel Macancela** and his wife Marycruz have struggled with various health issues: Manuel, with digestive problems and a recent case of food poisoning; and Marycruz, with fibromyalgia, peripheral vertigo, and recovery from a bacterial stomach infection.

However, for the first time in several months, Marycruz was able to travel with Pastor Manuel on his monthly 10-day trek to visit their established church in the jungle community of Morete Cocha. The pleasure of his wife's company was not the only blessing of the trip. Manuel wrote, *"With her [presence], we were able to go into several homes to visit the women. Four young ladies received Christ and will soon be taking the first step of obedience in baptism."*

Pastor Manuel encouraged believers in Morete Cocha to plan to participate in a missions trip he is mapping out along the Pastaza river. He knows of 8-10 unreached people groups living along the banks. The September mission will be the first in a series that aims to win lost souls and grow the work in Morete Cocha. This trip will also be the first of its kind for Manuel.



He admitted to feeling fear upon boarding this plane home to Shell. The day before, another plane crashed-landed in Shell, killing 3 people. But, he said, "Our fear vanished when we remembered that God is in control."
