Newfound Hope in Christ

Last month, we asked you to pray for **Gustavo Mis Alejos** and the church plant in **Chetumal, Mexico**. Escalating extortion calls, several robberies, and attempted robberies within the past few months (one that had Pastor Gustavo facing an armed man) led the group to leave their meeting place. While they searched, saved, and prayed for another, they met in one another's homes. Gustavo remarked that not only did this experience impress upon the church members that the *iglesia*, the "church," refers to those saved by faith in Christ rather than a physical place, but it also provided opportunities to draw closer to unchurched neighbors, family, and friends who were more open to in-home meetings.

Thank the Lord, our collective prayers were answered: Gustavo just signed a lease on a house that will serve as the new meeting place.

Pastor Gustavo and the believers of Community Baptist Bible Church are praying that those who had interest in the in-home meetings will start coming to regular services at the new location, as well as those who have just started attending regularly. An elderly lady named Ana has been coming since Christmas and has a great desire to learn about God although she cannot read or write.



In **Saltillo**, **Mexico**, as well, people are recognizing their need for something more in their lives. **Josué González Cano** and a few other men of the church began a boys' soccer team last month in order to bring the gospel message to a wider audience.



So far, they have made new contacts and renewed old relationships. Saul, a young man who Pastor Josué met about a year ago but later lost contact with, joined the team. Saul has struggled with family problems and antidepressant abuse in the past. Saul asked Josué when the church meets for services. He came to church along with his family and has sought pastoral counseling. Please pray for Saul and his family, that they would find something more in Christ.

In Saltillo, depression is rampant and the suicide rate is high. A few months ago, a man named Javier Nieves was so overcome with depression that he tried to take his own life. But, as Josué said, "the Lord took care of him." Javier recovered from his injuries and started seeking God. He came to church and over the course of several Sundays, Josué and



the believers shared the gospel with Javier. With a new hope in Christ, Javier attends regularly and is in counseling. He even prepared a Christmas dinner for the whole church.

Another Church Plant in Mexico

José Vazquez Zenteno, along with his wife, Erica, and their 6 children are working in Tijuana, Mexico. Consistent street evangelism efforts on José's part have brought 26 new visitors to church, with several professions of faith since the beginning of the year.



This growth has laid the foundation for more targeted church ministries. The couples of the church have sectioned off into their own Sunday School class. Currently, they are meeting under a tarped area, while the church is in the process of building an addition that will be another Sunday School classroom.

Letter from the Director

Dear friends, prayer warriors, and supporters of BEME-LA,

The fickle weather conditions and drastic changes to the landscape during March have earned descriptions from "lion" to "lamb." Our travels and experiences at BEME this month have mirrored those descriptions. Long days, tiresome nights, travel challenges and delays, driving in heavy rains, ice, and snow were contrasted with many life-changing decisions for Christ, educational advancements for staff (business conferences, classes, academic speaking opportunities), encouragement from believers, and several new supporting churches (VA, MI, and MN). Our faithful church starters have experienced everything from severe loss of homes, land, and building delays in their congregations due to weather and floods, to celebrations of church anniversaries, souls saved, baptisms and very fruitful evangelistic campaigns, camps, and conferences.







This year, March reminds us of Psalm 19. The Psalmist describes God's grand creation (vs. 1-6), God's truth shared with man (vs. 7-10), God's work within man (vs.11-13), concluding with a challenge to continue serving (vs.14): "Let the words of my mouth, and the meditation of my heart, be acceptable in thy sight, O LORD, my strength, and my redeemer." One pastor stated, "the composition of Psalm 19 as a whole brought David much needed relief...and has given hope to many generations of people who have struggled." Yes, the Lord is always close to his children through life's changes. Just think, it is in the struggling exhaustion of new tender plants pushing, twisting, expanding, that turn the frozen soil of winter into the lush fruitful fields of spring. A Church Begins, Another Thrives in Uruguay

BEME-LA has taken on another church planter in Uruguay! Pastor **Andrés Ramirez**, his wife Maria Eugenia, and their children Sara, Berenice, and Josias are starting a church in the city of **Nueva Helvecia**.



The Ramirez family has been witnessing and visiting contacts faithfully in the Juan Lacase neighborhood, and several people have made professions of faith over the past few months.

Artigas, Uruguay is one of many cities—primarily in Latin America, but in other areas, the U.S. included—that participates in some form of the annual *Carnaval* holiday. Carnaval traditions vary widely depending on the customs of the area, but their origins are tied to the time before the 40-day Lenten season and are characterized by a celebration of worldly indulgence over a period of days or weeks.

To have an idea of the challenges Pastor **Gustavo González** and the church in Artigas face during Carnaval, those living in the U.S. could imagine Mardi Gras as being a much more integral part of the culture as a whole, right outside their doorsteps.

Over the past few years, the youth group has grown to 20 faithful teens, some of whom have unbelieving families that participate in Carnaval. The Lord gave Pastor Gustavo the foresight to plan a teen retreat that overlapped the heaviest days of Carnaval. Mr. and Mrs. Sanchez, a couple that often helps with the youth group, welcomed the teens to stay at their home for 3 days while they were out of town. Without this retreat, Gustavo said that several of the teens would have been obligated by their families to participate in Carnaval activities.



It is hard to believe that almost 2 years have passed since BEME took on the González family. At the time, they were having Zoom Bible studies with a handful of people. Today, they meet in a rented building (which they are growing out of—please pray!) with 40 children faithfully attending Sunday School and 25 adults in services (most are saved and baptized members), in addition to the teens.

 - * Praise the Lord! Manuel Macancela finalized the purchase of a 3122 ft² plot of land in Shell. The next step is build a fence or wall enclosure, a covered metal structure, and 2 bathrooms
- For vehicle repair (Andrés Ramirez, Uruguay) and provision of vehicles for Josué González and Gustavo Mis (Mexico) to transport people to and from church and for other ministry purposes. A dear 77-year-old lady of Josué's church shared her burden for the children in a neighboring community, and since then, a few people of the church have started selling food to raise money for a van.
- For protection of those in Peru, with the current political unrest and recent severe damaging floods
 - * Our current national pastors: José Churata, Ernesto Vera, Sacarias Ccopa, Hetler Ramos, Hernan Huari, as well as many former BEME church starters and U.S. national missionaries
- For **Missionary Buddy Fitzgerald** (Peru) after the removal of a cancerous tumor on his spinal cord, the next steps are to determine if more are present and course of treatment.
- For the visitation and discipleship efforts of each one of our national pastors.
 - * Gustavo Huamani, Uruguay: this month, they have 4 upcoming baptisms, evangelism training for the church members, and the wedding of Cristian and Marlene!
