# **Letter from the Director / South America Trip Report**

## Dear friends, prayer warriors, and supporters of BEME LA,

We anticipated that the past month would be a busy and productive one for BEME. It did not disappoint!

Traveling to Ecuador brought exciting advancement for the spread of the gospel. The three-day pastors' conference and roundtables in the city of Santo Domingo, energized and produced direction for the Ecuadoran churches to send, promote, and organize mission programs, and to develop Ecuadorian mission boards. My trip continued to check on our church starters and included a plane ride into the jungle to meet new believers.





From there, BEME opened up Bolivia with its first applicant for church starting. This country is ripe for the gospel. The believers and pastors face second and third-world conditions and real pressure from the adversary. Pastor Enoc Quinteros has gone through multiple physical attacks just witnessing. His injuries have not stopped the start of his fledgling church. Though his facility is basic, the believers are bold and empowered by God.

Then, on to Peru for the 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the New Jerusalem Baptist Church of Trujillo. It was glorious! Part of the four-day celebration included youth and couples' sessions, and evangelistic meetings. A whole city block was closed off, lights were hung, speakers

were set up, and countless invitations were handed out by church members. The labor brought forth many who heard the gospel. Even the local bar stopped serving alcohol during the services! This church has started two other local churches, and it is a great testimony of God's blessing.

This South American trip allowed encouragement and accountability for our faithful church starters. It also added three more schools to our BEME network to draw new pastoral candidates. One school will have 15 men graduating for ministry this year alone!

I came back to the home office for two days of work, and then Jo and I were off to Kansas and Florida to present BEME in four more churches. We are prayerfully asking God for more durative financial support for church starting.

The devil is not happy with this progress. There have been many trials this past month, but God is ever so faithful. Please pray specifically for BEME's finances. We have men, their

families, new believers, and fledgling churches that are in need of our resources and support. These are "valuable gems in dark places" that need our help. "Wherefore we labor, that, whether present or absent, we may be accepted of Him." (2 Cor. 5:9)



# From the Ground Up

The believers of Pastor **José Vazquez**'s church plant in **Tijuana**, **Mexico** are also hard at work, sharing the good news door-to-door. This month, a few new people were added to the pickup route for Sunday services.



Pastor José is thankful for the prayers for the recovery of his arm following surgery to repair the damage he sustained in a fall in July. After starting physical therapy, he has a better range of motion, more usage, and less pain, overall.

The church is currently working on building a classroom that will serve as a Sunday school and discipleship classroom for married couples.



Tropical storm Hilary tore through Tijuana last month, and thankfully, the Lord brought the church family and its property safely through the storm. The extreme heat in the following weeks highlighted some improvements to be made to the building: mainly, replacing the metal sheets covering most of the existing structure, which trap the heat inside. The church is also prioritizing preparations for the rainy season that will begin in a month or so. Every year, this area is hit hard by heavy rains, making travel difficult, dangerous, and sometimes impossible.

Over 1300 miles south of Tijuana, members of **Josué González**'s church in **Saltillo** worked together to complete some much-needed restorations to the property.









In **Curahuasi**, **Peru**, the members of **Ernesto Vera**'s church are quite literally working the fields to earn money toward their collective goal of purchasing the building they currently rent.





While these problems often stem from positive changes—such as outgrowing a meeting space—they result in real needs, like purchasing land and construction or renovations, and would benefit greatly from your continued support in prayer.
