Over the course of many months, Peruvian pastors José Churata and Ernesto Vera have successfully built relationships with school leaders and gained access to teach Bible lessons to students near their church plants.

Recently, Pastor **Hetler Ramos** has also been campaigning to share the gospel in nearby schools. These open doors have allowed him to extend invitations to Bible club, youth group, and other church activities.

Ariel Alfonso in the Dominican Republic

In the months following the explosion of a propane tank near Pastor Ariel Alfonso's home, his church remains committed to spreading the hope of the gospel. community in San Cristobal is still reeling from the tragedy, which killed over 30 people and injured many others. Pastor Ariel gratefully reported that no church members were physically injured. Soon after the incident, the church members met in a neighborhood park to hand out supplies and share the good news. Pastor Ariel asked for prayer that God will use these painful times to draw people to Him.



One man started attending church regularly and, just recently, accepted the Lord as His Savior as a result of the church's regular canvassing efforts. Pastor Ariel is currently working with many others in discipleship and counseling and is expecting to hold a baptismal service in the near future.



In late summer, the church had a great turnout for the first two days of Vacation Bible School. Pastor Ariel shared, "There was a good group of kids who heard the gospel once again, and we teaching, really enjoved serving and spending time with them. Sadly, we had to interrupt the activities because our brother Justo went home to be with the Lord. We arranged the funeral services and helped his wife, sister Adriana. Please pray for her. Our brother [Justo] was a great and faithful worker who always trusted the Lord, but God had other plans to take him home."

For the members of this church plant, the recent trials and losses have emphasized the value of the church's ministries and propelled them to continue working. Lord-willing, next year we hope to report the start of a planned building project to expand the meeting place.

Ministry Highlights - Mexico, Ecuador, & Colombia

In the Mexican community of Las Lomas, the group of children attending Bible club has grown to 18! Since their homes are spread out and walking to church is not an option, Pastor Ignacio Salazar and this faithful helper started a route to bring the children to Bible club. Most of the children are from families struggling with issues stemming from drug addiction, alcoholism, and divorce. Some of their family members have made professions of faith, but most have not committed to attending Thursday services in Las Lomas.
